


Facing the Facts

- **Fentanyl** is a synthetic opioid that is 50x more potent than heroin and 100x more potent than morphine
- In 2022, the DEA found **6 out of 10** fake pills contain a lethal dose of fentanyl
- These pills are being sold on social media to look like Oxycontin, Percocet, Vicodin, Xanax, and stimulants like Adderall
 - Assume every pill you purchase today <u>WILL KILL</u>
 YOU
- Fentanyl powder is also being added to street drugs like cocaine, heroin, methamphetamine, marijuanna, gummies and even <u>illicit vapes</u>











Fentanyls Growth, Multi-substance, Youth Impact


Trends

- **CDC** reports 114% increase in adolescent overdose deaths between 2019 and 2021
 - Largest increase in history
 - 77% caused by fentanyl
- In 2022, 110,236 overdose deaths
- **CDC** reports that ½ of adolescent overdose deaths are witnessed
 - Most w/ no overdose response

More adults between 18 and 45 died of fentanyl overdoses in 2020 than COVID-19, motor vehicle accidents, cancer and suicide

Naloxone

- Life saving medication that reverses the effects of an opioid overdose
 - Should be available at all times like a first aid kit or an EpiPen
- ALWAYS call 9-1-1
 - Naloxone is a <u>temporary</u> treatment that lasts 30-90 minutes
 - Person should be monitored for several hours
- How to Use
 - Spray entire dose into one nostril of suspected overdose victim
 - If no response within 2 minutes, spray additional dose in the opposite nostril
 - Still no breathing? Perform CPR (if trained) or provide rescue breathing and wait for EMS to arrive
- **Safe for all ages and NO contraindications for use
- Most pharmacies have a standing order for obtaining naloxone
 - Fentanyl Fathers has samples of naloxone available
 - Talk to your school nurse or principal for more information




Recognize & Respond to an **Overdose**

- CALL 9-1-1 and administer naloxone if any of these signs are present...
 - Small, constricted "pinpoint pupils"
 - Falling asleep or losing consciousness
 - Slow, weak, or no breathing
 - Choking or gurgling sounds
 - Limp body
 - Cold and/or clammy pale skin
 - Discolored purple or blue lips and nails
- **3-4 Minutes** without breathing causes brain injury
 - 6-10 Minutes leads to coma and Death
- National EMS Information System reports <u>average response</u> <u>time</u> to an overdose is just under 10 minutes (9.9 Minutes)
 - YOU may be a person's ONLY chance of <u>staying alive</u>

Good Samaritan Law

- Protects against drug possession charges for those that seek medical assistance for an overdose.
- You will <u>NEVER</u> get in trouble for giving naloxone to a <u>suspected</u> overdose victim
 - Protected under naloxone distribution laws
- SAVING A LIFE is more important than SAVING A FRIENDSHIP
 - If you see something SAY SOMETHING
- ALWAYS Call 9-1-1 if you witness an overdose
 - <u>Failing</u> to call can lead to criminal charges depending on the circumstances and location of the event
